
Through our work we are aware that we have an impact on the social, economic and local environment. We are committed to the prevention of pollution and intend to build on this environmental policy to achieve continual environmental improvement year on year.

It is Enfys' Policy to:

- Remain aware of and comply with all relevant environmental legislation.
- Ensure that all waste management practices are carried out in line with the Duty of Care Regulations.
- Recycle and reuse, for the benefit of the community and the local environment, any furniture and electrical items donated by local residents.
- Effectively implement and continue to manage at least level 2 of the Green Dragon Environmental Standard.
- Operate our vehicles in an appropriate manner to ensure that the most direct route is taken, and co-ordinate the collection and delivery of items to minimise unnecessary mileage.
- Communicate via the internet where possible to minimise the need for paper communication. When paper is used we promote the re-use of scrap paper to reduce the amount needed to purchase as new.
- Hold effective emergency procedures to ensure minimal risk to personnel and the local environment.
- Raise awareness amongst our staff about their individual responsibility to act in an environmental responsible manner.

This policy is available to all external parties, is available on our website and will be reviewed annually by senior management to ensure statements remain relevant to the organisations activities.
